



Notes on Data Source:

- Estimates are for the civilian, non-institutionalized working-age population and were calculated using American Community Survey three-year (2005-2007) estimates downloaded from the American Fact Finder (factfinder.census.gov).
- Estimates for Hamilton and Schuyler counties are not available at the county level due to small populations. Estimates for these counties are based on a larger geographic areas called a Public Use Microdata Area (PUMA). The estimates for Hamilton County use data combined across Clinton County, Essex County, Franklin County, and Hamilton County. Hamilton County accounts for approximately 3% of the population of this PUMA. Estimates for Schuyler County are based on data including both Chemung County and Schuyler County. Schuyler accounts for approximately 18% of this PUMA.
- The ACS in 2005-2007 includes six questions that are used to identify the population with disabilities. A disability is defined as an affirmative response to one or more of the six disabilities identified by the questions. The six questions as asked in the 2003-2005 ACS surveys are as follows (the specific type of disability is in brackets following the question):

Q15. Does this person have any of the following long lasting conditions:

- Blindness, deafness, or a severe vision or hearing impairment? [*Sensory Disability*]
- A condition that substantially limits one or more basic physical activities such as walking, climbing stairs, reaching, lifting, or carrying? [*Physical Disability*]

Q16. Because of a physical, mental, or emotional condition lasting 6 months or more, does this person have any difficulty in doing any of the following activities:

- Learning, remembering, or concentrating? [*Mental disability*]
- Dressing, bathing, or getting around inside the home? [*Self-care disability*]

[Answer Question 17 only if this person is age 15 or older.]

Q17. Because of a physical, mental, or emotional condition lasting 6 months or more, does this person have any difficulty in doing any of the following activities:

- Going outside the home alone to shop or visit a doctor's office? [*Go-Outside-Home Disability*]
- Working at a job or business? [*Employment Disability*].
